PERSONAL POLICING – DEALING WITH LOCAL CONCERNS	
1. The number of burglaries.	1.1 To reduce the number of burglaries by 3%. (1)
	1.2 To increase the detection rate for burglary by 2 percentage points. (1)
2. The availability of illegal drugs and the ability of drug dealers to engage in criminal activity.	2.1 To increase the amount of drug seizure incidents. (1,2)
	2.2 To increase the number of persons reported, charged, or formally cautioned for drug offences. (1)
3. The number of antisocial behaviour incidents.	3.1 To establish a Baseline of the number of antisocial behaviour incidents during Quarter 1 and achieve a reduction in subsequent quarters. (3)
	3.2 To report quarterly on alcohol interventions with the objective of reducing on street drinking, proactively targeting those selling alcohol to minors, and reporting persistent offenders.
PROFESSIONAL POLICING – DELIVERING AN EXCELLENT SERVICE	
4. The level of community confidence.	4.1 To report on initiatives and partnerships aimed at improving community confidence.
	4.2 To report quarterly on efforts to increase communication and follow up between police and victims of crime.
	4.3 To provide quarterly, qualitative information on strategies and trends to include progress and constraints across all crime types and quarterly seasonal variations on antisocial behaviour. (3)
5. The visibility of police in the local area.	5.1 To report quarterly on neighbourhood policing to ensure that neighbourhood police officers work at least 80% of their duty hours on neighbourhood policing duties in their local area.
6. Engagement with the community.	6.1 To engage with residents, neighbourhoods, the community and other partners for the purpose of tackling identified problems together.
PROTECTIVE POLICING – TACKLING SERIOUS HARM	
7. The number of violence with injury crimes.	7.1 To reduce the number of non-domestic violence with injury crimes by 3%. (1,4,5)
8. The percentage of recorded crimes detected.	8.1 To increase the detection rate for violence with injury crimes by 3 percentage points. (1,5)
	8.2 To increase the detection rate for domestic violence with injury crimes by 5 percentage points. (1,4)

NOTES

1. Targets will be measured against performance achieved during 2010/2011.
2. The value of drugs seized, and the number of drug searches conducted, specifying type of search, will be reported quarterly via the DPP reports.
3. Section 3(1)(a) of the Anti-Social Behaviour (NI) Order 2004 defines Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) as: a person who has acted in an anti-social manner, that is to say, in a manner that caused or was likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more persons not of the same household.
4. Domestic abuse is an under reported crime. Measures will be taken by the Police Service to increase and encourage reporting of domestic violence crimes by providing victims with the confidence to make a report to police. Police in North Belfast will continue to seek to improve detection rates for domestic violence related crime as stated.
5. Violence with injury crimes are defined as offences of murder, manslaughter, infanticide, child destruction, attempted murder, causing death/GBH by dangerous driving / aggravated vehicle taking, wounding / GBH with Intent, firearms / explosives offences endangering life, administering poison, wounding / GBH and AOABH.
