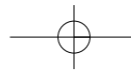

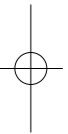
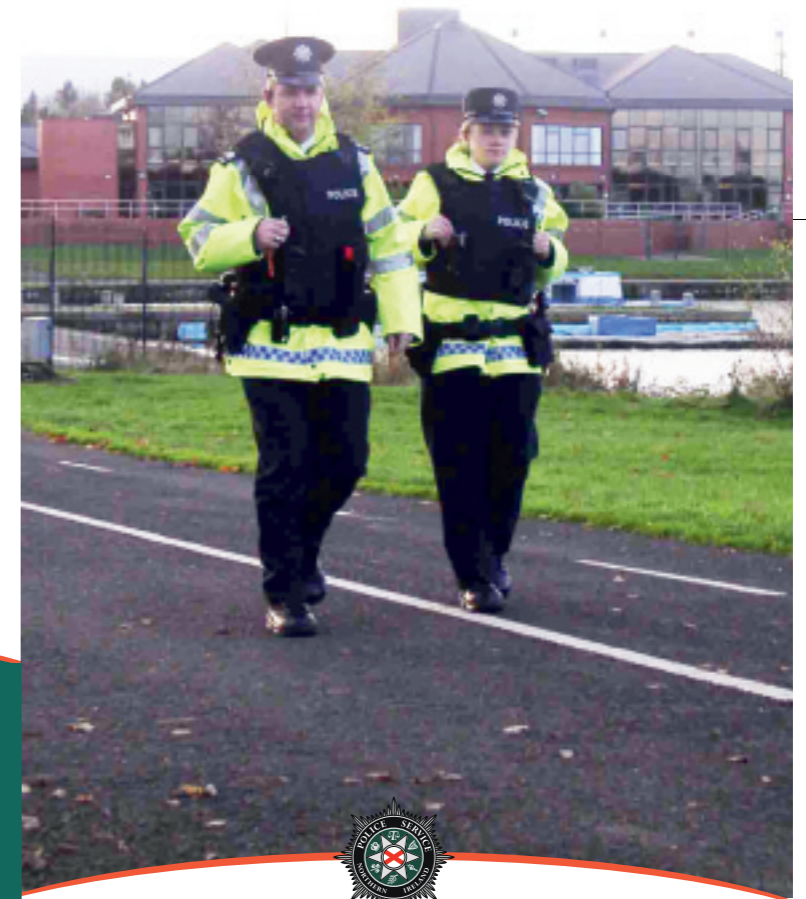

Notes

- (1) Non-domestic violence with injury crimes are defined as offences of murder, manslaughter, infanticide, child destruction, attempted murder, causing death/GBH by dangerous driving/aggravated vehicle taking, wounding/GBH with intent, firearms/explosives offences endangering life, administering poison, wounding/GBH and AOABH – which do not have a domestic motivation attributed to them. Domestic abuse is an under-reported crime. Measures will be taken by the service to increase and encourage reporting of domestic violence with injury by providing victims with the confidence to make a report to police. Police will continue to seek to improve clearance rates for domestic related violent crime.
- (2) Targets will be measured against performance achieved during 2009/10.
- (3) Target measured against 2007/08 data. This is consistent with Key Performance Indicator 3 of the Northern Ireland Office's Public Service Agreement 'Make Communities Safer'.
- (4) This includes supply offences and possession of controlled drugs with intent to supply.
