Sanction clearances include the following clearance types; charge/summons, TIC, adult caution, adult informed warning, juvenile restorative caution, juvenile informed warning and juvenile prosecutorial diversion.

### NOTES:

- (1) Targets will be measured against performance achieved at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2007.
- (2) Violent crime – includes offences against the person, sexual offences and robberies.
- (3) Target to be achieved by placing a particular focus on criminal damage to vehicles and dwellings.
