Burglary

- Maximum use of Area, District and Regional resources to conduct preventative and proactive intelligence led operations.
- Default patrolling by response officers in analysed 'hot spot' locations.
- Intrusive monitoring of specifically identified District and Area offenders and proactive policing of bail conditions.
- Robust forensic policy and attendance of CSIs at scenes of crimes.
- Maximum use of media to inform members of the public of crime trends and to offer crime prevention advice.
- NPT officers call in with business premises to offer crime prevention advice.
- Alerting of NW co-ordinators to make them aware of crime trends.

ASB

- Op Snapper operations to deter and detect underage drinking;
- Involvement with inter agency ASBO Forum;
- Involvement in CSP initiative in Crossgar including diversionary programmes and joint patrols with enforcement officers.
- Maximum use of POPT to tackle ASB.
- Proactive enforcement of licensing laws;
- Implementation of surgeries and use of mobile police station to offer reassurance/crime prevention advice.
- Maximum use of ABC/ASBOs.
- Full use of youth diversion scheme and robust prosecution policy.

KSIs

- Ongoing operations involving local resources and Roads Policing to conduct anti-speeding patrols;
- Use of safety camera van
- Proactive operations to prevent and detect 'boy racers' and prosecution of offences.

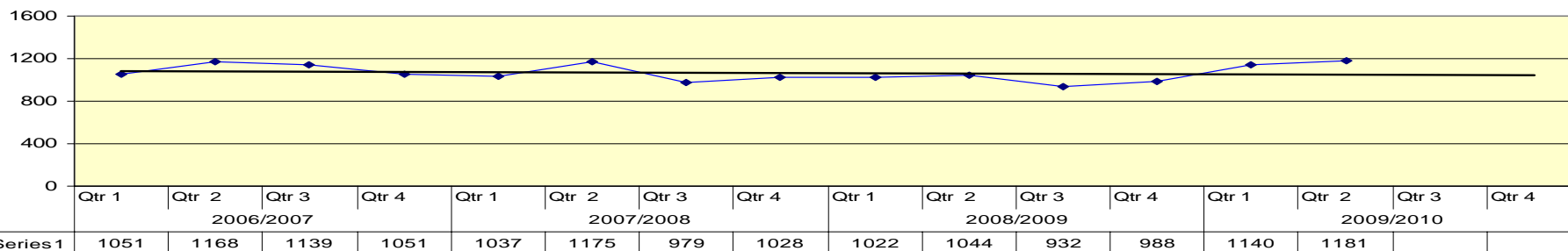

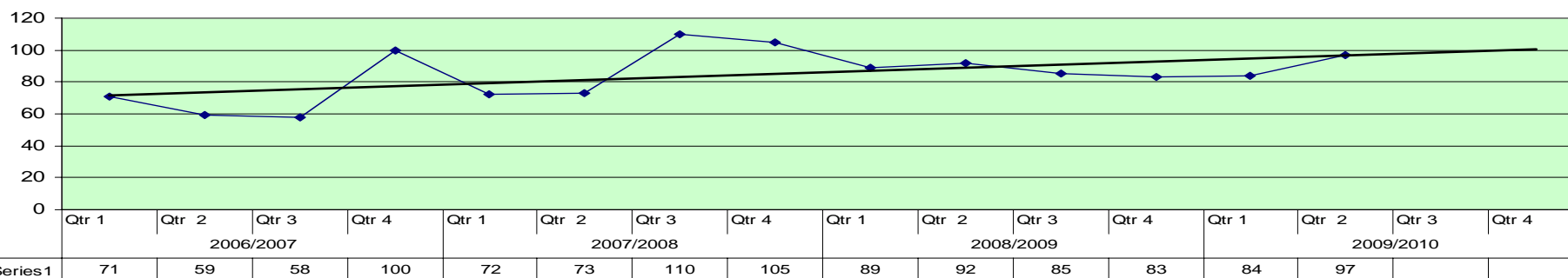

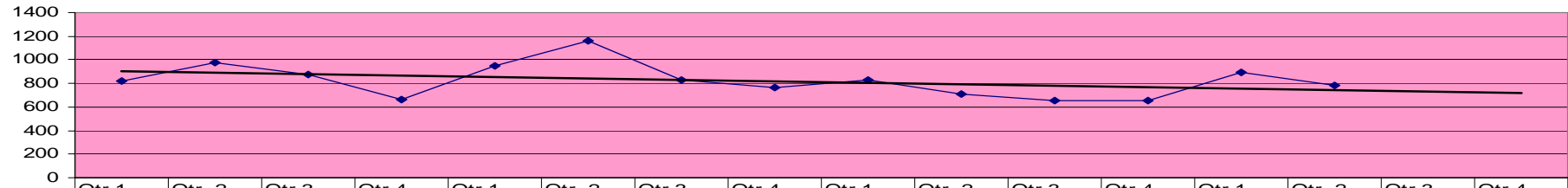
All Crime
