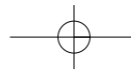
We will continue to build on our quality of service, to improve the individual's experience of the police service.

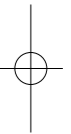
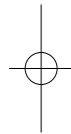

Notes

- (1) Non-domestic violence with injury crimes are defined as offences of murder, manslaughter, infanticide, child destruction, attempted murder, causing death/GBH by dangerous driving /aggravated vehicle taking, wounding/GBH with intent, firearms/explosives offences endangering life, administering poison, wounding/GBH and AOABH - which do not have a domestic motivation attributed to them. Domestic Abuse is an under-reported crime. Measures will be taken by the Police Service to increase and encourage reporting of domestic violence with injury by providing victims with the confidence to make a report to police. Police will continue to seek to improve clearance rates for Domestic related Violent Crime.
- (2) Targets will be measured against performance achieved during 2009/10.
- (3) Target measured against 2007/08 data. This is consistent with Key Performance Indicator 3 of the Northern Ireland Office's Public Service Agreement, "Make Communities Safer".
- (4) This will form part of the overall strategy which includes education and awareness of drugs issues in conjunction with our partners.
