- <sup>1</sup> The crime figures for target 3.1.1 presented in this report for the current financial year to date include both crimes already validated by Central Statistics Branch and incidents known to be crimes but which are currently under process. Using this more inclusive figure gives a more accurate indication of the change in crime between the current and previous financial years to date. This undercount is only available for overall crime levels. It is not possible to provide an undercount in relation to the targets for violent crime, criminal damage and domestic burglary. For the current financial year to date, 96.1% of crimes have been validated by Central Statistics Branch, leaving around 3,350 crimes currently under process.
- <sup>2</sup> The rural and urban figures for 2008/09 may not add to the overall total as some crimes have yet to be allocated to a District.
- <sup>3</sup> More serious violent crime includes offences of murder, manslaughter, infanticide, child destruction, attempted murder, causing death/GBH by dangerous driving /aggravated vehicle taking, wounding/GBH with intent, firearms/explosives offences endangering life, administering poison and wounding/GBH.
- <sup>4</sup> During 2007/08 the age of the victim was unknown in 2.4% of all violent crimes, ranging from 1.1% in F District to 5.4% in A District. For 2008/09 to date this figure stands at 2.9%, ranging from 1.9% in C District to 5.7% in A District.
- <sup>5</sup> The figures for repeat victimisation (domestic abuse) are based on a count of the number of individuals who have been the victim of a crime with a domestic abuse motivation on more than one occasion during the specified 12 month periods provided.
- <sup>6</sup> The figures shown only reflect impact on crime gangs achieved by drug squad. The 2008/09 figures are ongoing totals that are changing on a continuous basis in accordance with successes against crime gangs. Success should be evaluated in terms of how the PSNI is progressing throughout the year towards exceeding the previous years outcomes.
- <sup>7</sup> Seized figures are those for cash seizures. Recovered figures are those where successful confiscations were obtained in court. The figures do not take into account assets under restraint.
- <sup>8</sup> The rural and urban figures for 2007/08 and 2008/09 may not add to the overall total as some incidents are not allocated to a District (eg those occurring in a motorway location).
- <sup>9</sup> The sickness figures are measured against what would be expected for each month on a cumulative basis. The target to be achieved by 31 March 2009 for police officers and civilian staff is 7 days which equates to 0.58 days for each month. On a cumulative basis this becomes 0.58 for April, 1.17 for April-May, 1.75 for April to June etc. The total average working days lost for the current financial year to date are presented against these targets.
