- <sup>1</sup> This figure covers emergency response times where the time of arrival is available, duplicate incidents and false alarms are excluded. During 2006/07 there were a total of 26,556 such emergency response incidents. An arrival time was available for 70.2% (18,654) of these incidents while there was no arrival time available for 7,902 incidents. During 2007/08 there were a total of 21,664 such emergency response incidents. An arrival time was available for 77.4% (16,776) of these incidents while there was no arrival time available for 4,888 incidents.
- <sup>2</sup> During 2006/07 the age of the victim was unknown in 1.7% of all violent crimes, ranging from 0.9% in H District to 4.4% in A District. For 2007/08 this figure stands at 2.4%, ranging from 1.1% in F District to 5.4% in A District.
- <sup>3</sup> The figures shown only reflect impact on crime gangs achieved by drug squad. The 2007/08 figures are ongoing totals that are changing on a continuous basis in accordance with successes against crime gangs. Success should be evaluated in terms of how the PSNI is progressing throughout the year towards exceeding the previous years outcomes.
- <sup>4</sup> The sickness figures are measured against what would be expected for each month on a cumulative basis. The target for police officers and civilian staff is 10 days which equates to 0.83 days for each month. On a cumulative basis this becomes 0.83 for April, 1.67 for April-May, 2.5 for April to June etc. The total average working days lost for the current financial year to date are presented against these targets.
