Request and Answer:

This is to inform you that the Police Service of Northern Ireland has now completed its search for the information you requested. The decision has been taken to disclose the located information to you in full.

Question 1

I wish to request full details of the amount of money spent by the PSNI covering the disturbances in the Holyland area of Belfast on March 17, 2009. This should include how much it regularly costs to police the area, compared to the increase during the disturbances. Answer

The total cost of policing the disturbances in the Holyland area on 17th March 2009 was £35,612.22.

Costings for the regular policing of the Holyland area are not collated as the cost of policing in any specific area fluctuates on a daily basis depending on what resources are deployed at any one time, e.g. Neighbourhood Policing Team, response, CID, Crime Team etc.

Given the nature and extent of the disorder, the police operation aimed at protecting lives and property in the area was proportionate and appropriate. A number of police officers were injured during the substantial and sustained disorder, with officers coming under attack from fireworks and other missiles. So far, 11 people have been charged and 12 more have been reported for a number of offences, including riotous/disorderly behaviour, malicious damage and assault on police. A Special Investigation Team has been set up to look into the disturbances and bring those responsible before the courts.

If you are dissatisfied in any way with the handling of your request, you have the right to request a review. You should do this as soon as possible, or in any case within two months of the date of issue of this letter. If following an internal review, carried out by an independent decision maker, you were to remain dissatisfied in any way with the handling of the request you may make a complaint, under Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act, to the Information Commissioner's Office and ask that they investigate whether the PSNI has complied with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act. You can write to the Information Commissioner at Information Commissioner's Office, Wycliffe House, Water Lane, Wilmslow, Cheshire, SK9 5AF. In most circumstances the Information Commissioner will not investigate a complaint unless an internal review procedure has been carried out, however the Commissioner has the

option to investigate the matter at his discretion.
