Request

I am a legal academic at Durham University, researching terrorist related murders in Northern Ireland following the Belfast / Good Friday Agreement.

In particular;

(a) I would like to access the names of individuals who were killed in terrorist related (security situation) incidents in Northern Ireland from May 2004 to January 2010.

(b) I would also like the date of the incident

I hope you will be able to respond to this request.

Answer

This is to inform you that the Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) has now completed its search for the information you requested. The decision has been taken to disclose the located information to you.

Note:

1. Includes all murders which were considered at the time of the incident, to be directly attributed to terrorism or where the cause has a direct or proximate link to subversive/sectarian strife and is based on the Investigating Officer's perception of the incident at the time. For some murders where it was initially unclear as to whether it was security related or not it would be decided by the Senior Investigating Officer as to whether it goes on this list. If it was initially thought no security situation involvement and it later turned out to be related then there are no procedures in place to update this list. Also please note this list is used for statistical analysis only and is not used as an investigative tool.

If you are dissatisfied in any way with the handling of your request, you have the right to request a review. You should do this as soon as possible, or in any case within two months of the date of issue of this letter. In the event that you require a review to be undertaken, you can do so by writing to the Head of Freedom of Information, PSNI Headquarters, 65 Knock Road, Belfast, BT5 6LE or by emailing foi@psni.pnn.police.uk.

If following an internal review, carried out by an independent decision maker, you were to remain dissatisfied in any way with the handling of the request you may make a complaint, under Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act, to the Information Commissioner's Office and ask that they investigate whether the PSNI has complied with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act. You can write to the Information Commissioner at Information Commissioner's Office, Wycliffe House, Water Lane, Wilmslow, Cheshire, SK9 5AF. In most circumstances the Information Commissioner will not investigate a complaint unless an internal review procedure has been carried out, however the Commissioner has the option to investigate the matter at his discretion.
