#### Question

Request for details in relation to a kidnapping case.

#### Answer

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 14 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the decision has been taken to refuse your request as it has been deemed a 'Vexatious Request'. Section 14 (1) of the Act does not oblige a public authority to comply with a request for information if the request is vexatious.

The PSNI's response to your request F-2010-03589 issued on the 21<sup>st</sup> January 2011, advised you that we were treating this request as vexatious and explained the reasoning behind this decision. As this further request refers to subject matter as defined in F-2010-03589, it has also been deemed vexatious as it falls under information relating to investigations.

I confirm that any further requests made under the Act for information relating to the incidents in which you were involved and any subsequent requests in this area will be categorised as vexatious and will not be administered in any capacity.

If you are dissatisfied in any way with the handling of your request, you have the right to request a review. You should do this as soon as possible, or in any case within two months of the date of issue of this letter. If following an internal review, carried out by an independent decision maker, you were to remain dissatisfied in any way with the handling of the request you may make a complaint, under Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act, to the Information Commissioner's Office and ask that they investigate whether the PSNI has complied with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act. You

can write to the Information Commissioner at Information Commissioner's Office, Wycliffe House, Water Lane, Wilmslow, Cheshire, SK9 5AF. In most circumstances the Information Commissioner will not investigate a complaint unless an internal review procedure has been carried out, however the Commissioner has the option to investigate the matter at his discretion.
