### Request and Answer:

This is to inform you that the Police Service of Northern Ireland has now completed its search for the information you requested. The decision has been taken to disclose the located information to you in full.

### Question

I wish to make a Freedom of Information Act request regarding the recent decision taken in January to purchase new Tangi Land Rovers from a consortium led by OVIK Ltd, including ABBA Commercials.

I am interested in the whole decision and particularly the ownership of the Intellectual property for the design of the vehicle and the standard of armouring being provided by the winning bidder.

### Answer

The selection of the winning bidder was made following a full and vigorous evaluation of tender submissions. In accordance with the Contract Terms and Conditions all Intellectual property resides within PSNI.

The standard of armouring being provided by the winning bidder is provided in the build specification. Minimum B6 standard or equivalent.

If you are dissatisfied in any way with the handling of your request, you have the right to request a review. If following an internal review, carried out by an independent decision maker, you were to remain dissatisfied in any way with the handling of the request you may make a complaint, under Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act, to the Information Commissioner's Office and ask that they investigate whether the PSNI has complied with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act. You can write to the Information Commissioner at Information Commissioner's Office, Wycliffe House, Water Lane, Wilmslow, Cheshire, SK9 5AF. In most circumstances the Information Commissioner will not investigate a complaint unless an internal review procedure has been carried out, however the Commissioner has the option to investigate the matter at his discretion.
