Subject: Property Stolen from PSNI

Request and Answer:

This is to inform you that the Police Service of Northern Ireland has now completed its search for the information you requested. The decision has been taken to disclose the located information to you in full.

Question

Under the FOIA, between the period 1 May 2010 and 1 May 2011, I would like an itemised list of items or property belonging, loaned, leased or confiscated by your force that have been stolen (including items such as confiscated drugs)

If possible, I would like this information itemised and broken down by cost preferably in an excel spreadsheet.

Clarification received: To clarify, I would like details of items that are believed to have been stolen from PSNI. These may be items that PSNI own, have been leased or loaned to PSNI, or have been confiscated by PSNI.

If drugs that have been confiscated by PSNI are believed to have been subsequently stolen, it would be helpful if you could list the types of substance.

Answer

Please see the table at the end of this correspondence, detailing items stolen from PSNI for the period May 1, 2010 – April 30, 2011.

If you are dissatisfied in any way with the handling of your request, you have the right to request a

review. You should do this as soon as possible, or in any case within two months of the date of issue of this letter. In the event that you require a review to be undertaken, you can do so by writing to the Head of Freedom of Information, PSNI Headquarters, 65 Knock Road, Belfast, BT5 6LE or by emailing foi@psni.pnn.police.uk.

If following an internal review, carried out by an independent decision maker, you were to remain dissatisfied in any way with the handling of the request you may make a complaint, under Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act, to the Information Commissioner's Office and ask that they investigate whether the PSNI has complied with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act. You can write to the Information Commissioner at Information Commissioner's Office, Wycliffe House, Water Lane, Wilmslow, Cheshire, SK9 5AF. In most circumstances the Information Commissioner will not investigate a complaint unless an internal review procedure has been carried out, however the Commissioner has the option to investigate the matter at his discretion.
