Request and Answer:

Question

The total number of motorists detected travelling at 100mph and over in the districts of Dungannon, Cookstown, Armagh and Magherafelt and the convictions that came after that, this year so far and over the past 5 years if possible.

Clarification received: That's ok, if you could provide stats based on the number of motorists detected by the NI Road Safety Partnership (i.e. Safety Cameras) who were travelling \geq 100mph in the requested police areas, I would appreciate it. The areas are Dungannon, Cookstown, Armagh and Magherafelt for this year and over the past five years (or how the number of years that's possible up to five) for motorists caught travelling 100mph or over.

Answer

This is to inform you that the Police Service of Northern Ireland has now completed its search for the information you requested. The decision has been taken to disclose the located information to you in full.

The table at the end of this correspondence provides the information requested for persons detected by the safety camera at travelling over 100 mph in the areas of Armagh, Cookstown, Dungannon and Magherafelt.

If you are dissatisfied in any way with the handling of your request, you have the right to request a review. You should do this as soon as possible, or in any case within two months of the date of issue of this letter. If following an internal review, carried out by an independent decision maker, you were to remain

dissatisfied in any way with the handling of the request you may make a complaint, under Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act, to the Information Commissioner's Office and ask that they investigate whether the PSNI has complied with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act. You can write to the Information Commissioner at Information Commissioner's Office, Wycliffe House, Water Lane, Wilmslow, Cheshire, SK9 5AF. In most circumstances the Information Commissioner will not investigate a complaint unless an internal review procedure has been carried out, however the Commissioner has the option to investigate the matter at his discretion.
