

ADDITIONAL OPERATION RESTRICTIONS FOR PSNI



POLICE SERVICE OF NORTHERN IRELAND
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The National Police Chiefs' Council (NPCC) Guidelines on Police Requirements & Response to Security Systems has been adopted by Police Service of Northern Ireland and can be found at www.securebydesign.com and www.psni.police.uk. The following variations permitted under the terms of the Guidelines apply to this police area.

2.3. List of Compliant Companies Installing Type A Security Systems

2.3.2.

(b) Addition - PSNI will carry out criminal record checks every five years, this will be implemented on a staggered basis.

(f) Logistics dictate that Compliant Companies operating in Northern Ireland must have a minimum of two engineers with a 4 hour maximum response time. These engineers will be subject to criminal record checks by the PSNI.

2.6. Notice to Install TYPE A Security Systems

PSNI correspondence with key holder information will only be accepted by post or hand delivered not electronically.

2.8. Keyholders

2.8.1. PSNI has elected to retain a database of key holders and request that this information is updated via your security company annually to comply with the Data Protection Act 1998.

Key holders tasking of police will be recorded against the URN.

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2.10. False Alarm Monitoring

2.10.2. Definition

(f) Once an alarm activation has been passed to the police, it will be recorded as such on the Police Command and Control system and, if this transpires to be a false call, will count as a false activation as regards determining which response level applies to the premises. If police are contacted and informed that they need not attend (e.g. accidentally set off when locking up) the false activation will not be removed from the history log and will still count towards the maximum allowed in a rolling 12 month period. (3 x activations on an intruder alarm and 2 x activations on a Hold-up device)
