# 4. Drug Seizures and Arrests

Data Quality: The PSNI's statistics on the drug seizures are collated by the PSNI's Central Statistics Branch and are based on paper returns that are completed by police officers when they make a drug seizure. The statistics are checked for completeness with local Districts and with the PSNI Drug Squad and are also cross-referenced against other internal records of drug seizures.

## 4. Drug Seizures and Arrests

### Summary

#### Total Seizures

- A total of 3,198 drug seizure incidents were recorded in 2008/09, an increase of 7.7% on 2007/08. As in previous years cannabis was the drug most commonly seized.

#### Class A Seizures

- The number of seizures involving Class A drugs decreased by 7.6% from 854 seizure incidents in 2007/08 to 789 in 2008/09.
- Cocaine accounted for the greatest number of Class A seizure incidents. The amount of cocaine powder seized increased from 17.9 kg in 2007/08 to 24.2 kg in 2008/09 despite a decrease in the number of cocaine powder seizures (405 in 2007/08 compared with 345 in 2008/09).
- The number of ecstasy tablets seized decreased substantially from 244,720 tablets in 2007/08 to 34,404 in 2008/09.

#### Class B Seizures

- There were 525 class B seizure incidents in 2008/09 compared to 145 seizure incidents in 2007/08. However, the 2008/09 total includes those seizures of cannabis after the 26<sup>th</sup> January 2009, when the drug was reclassified from a Class C to a Class B.
- There were fewer seizures of amphetamine powder (95 in 2008/09 compared with 132 in 2007/08) and the amount of amphetamine powder seized decreased from 12.7 kg in 2007/08 to 5.5 kg in 2008/09.

#### Cannabis Seizures

- Seizures of cannabis increased by 11.9%, from 2,219 in 2007/08 to 2,484 in 2008/09.
- There has been a dramatic increase in the number of cannabis plants seized this year (from 4,006 cannabis plants seized in 2007/08 compared with 30,904 plants in 2008/09). Seizures of cannabis plants alone accounted for over £15 million of the street value of drugs seized this year.
- Seizures of cannabis resin increased by 10.1% from 1,480 seizures in 2007/08 to 1,630 in 2008/09. The amount of cannabis resin seized also increased substantially (from 78.2 kg in 2007/08 compared with 743.1 kg in 2008/09).
- There was also an increase in the amount of herbal cannabis seized (from 70.1 kg in 2007/08 to 248.8 kg in 2008/09).

#### Arrests

- The number of persons arrested for drug related offences increased by 6.2% from 1,896 in 2007/08 to 2,014 in 2008/09.
