Updating Android Operating System (OS)

Updating an Android OS is relatively straightforward and can be done over-the-air using just the device with the OS. Steps for updating Android for mobile device

- 1. Review what Android OS the device is currently running.

- 4. Option "Software Update" or "Software Update Check". Choosing etiher of these options will prompt you to proceed with the update.
- 5. Selecting "Update" will download the latest OS.
- 6. Once the download has finished, installation will be completed once you reboot your device.
