Request and Answer:

Your request for information has now been considered. In respect of Section 1(1)(a) of the Act I can confirm that the Police Service of Northern Ireland does hold information to which your request relates. The decision has been taken to disclose the following.

Request 1

The number of officers employed by your force who were complained about by members of the public in the last 12 months.

Answer

During the last 12 months a total of 1,231 officers have been subject to a complaint by a member of the public.

Request 2

Please state how many officers received each number of complaints detailed in the first column of the table below? Please avoid any grouping such as '1 to 5 complaints', '6 to 10 complaints' etc.

Answer

The number of complaints received by individual officers was as below:

If you are dissatisfied in any way with the handling of your request, you have the right to request a review. You should do this as soon as possible or in any case within two months of the date of issue of this letter. If, following an Internal Review carried out by an independent decision maker, you remain dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you may make a complaint to the Information Commissioner's Office, under Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act, and ask that they investigate whether the PSNI has complied with the terms of the Freedom of Information Act. In most circumstances, the Information Commissioner will not investigate a complaint unless an internal review procedure has been carried out however, the Commissioner has the option to investigate the matter at their discretion.
