Helping to trace missing people with Dementia



What is it?

The Herbert Protocol is an initiative that helps locate a person with dementia if they go missing.

How will it work?

If you live with dementia or care for someone who does, you should download the Herbert Protocol form on the PSNI website

You will then be required to fill in relevant information about the person with dementia including details of medication, significant places to visit, daily routines, a description and a photograph.

The form should be stored safely as it may need to be located quickly, at any time of day or night.

The police will ask for the form, if the person is reported as missing.

What do I do if someone I care for goes missing?

If someone you care for goes missing you should make an attempt to locate them. especially if this is a pattern of behaviour.

If you cannot locate them, you should contact Police on 101 or 999 in an emergency.

Police will conduct a search for the missing person based on the information provided in the Herbert Protocol form, to find them quickly as possible.

Every minute is crucial in a missing person search.
