## Police Recorded Road Traffic Collision Statistics Consultation Meetings

Much of the feedback from users of this data comes from informal discussions which take place in response to requests for information or general one-off queries about the data already provided. In addition to this PSNI statisticians are required to attend and provide input into a number of cross-departmental strategy groups.

- DateMeeting / ConsultationSeptember 2011Meeting with colleagues from DOE and DRD to discuss the strategic plan for the<br/>Annual Report. It was decided that the annual report should be in a 'web-based'<br/>format and should continue along the lines of the similar report completed by the<br/>Department for Transport. This will mean comparability with England and Wales is<br/>maintained. It was also recommended that we provide the data in Excel format on the<br/>website which has since been introduced.
- February to June 2013 Formal consultation with users of the Detailed Annual Report. The aim of this consultation was to allow users to have their say with regards to the more detailed annual report that was previously published nine months after the end of the calendar year. PSNI Statisticians attend the Road Safety Research Co-ordination Group (RSRCG) Twice per year with partner agencies including NI Fire and Rescue Service, NI Ambulance Service, Department for Infrastructure and Transport NI. Annually PSNI statisticians represent the organisation at SCRAS, the Standing Committee on Road Accident Statistics at Westminster, to keep up-to-date with national developments planned for the recording of road traffic collision statistics across the UK, most recently in December 2016. The PSNI's Road Traffic Collision Statistics are regularly monitored by Board On-going members and officials at the Northern Ireland Policing Board. Road Traffic Collision statistics are also included as indicators in the NI Road Safety Strategy 2020 and the NI Policing Plan. The PSNI's Road Traffic Collision Statistics are used by policy colleagues within On-going PSNI and statisticians attend various PSNI steering groups and working groups.
