Subject: Hate Crime Against Police Officers

### Request and Answer:

Your request for information has now been considered. In respect of Section 1(1)(a) of the Act we can confirm that the Police Service of Northern Ireland does hold information to which your request relates and the decision has been taken to disclose the following.

# Request

This is a request under the Freedom of Information Act for data on hate crimes charged in which the victim was a police officer or employee. For each year 2017/18, 2018/19, 2019/20 please provide:

- a) Numbers of hate crimes charged.
- b) Numbers of hate crimes charged in which the victim was a police officer or employee.
- c) Numbers of hate crimes charged in which the victim was a police officer and the hate crime was a non-violent public order offence (i.e (c) is a subset of (b)).

There should be nine data points in your response.

#### Answer

As per previous advice provided on 11<sup>th</sup> February 2021, the following response is based on police officers only.

Please see the table below detailing recorded hate offences with an assigned outcome of 'Charge/Charged Alternate', 2017/18 - 2019/20.

## The following notes are applicable to the data provided

The following table is based on the number of recorded hate offences which have resulted in an assigned outcome of 'Charged' or 'Charged Alternate', in the years 2017/18 - 2019/20. Each included offence will have involved one or more hate motivations

An outcome of 'Charged Alternate' is assigned to a recorded offence when a suspect is charged with an alternative, lesser offence than that which has been recorded in accordance with the Home Office Counting Rules. The material facts relating to the circumstances of the originally recorded crime remain the same. A 'lesser offence' is an offence which carries a lesser penalty.

There may be recorded hate offences from the period covered which have not yet received an assigned outcome. These may yet result in an outcome of 'Charged/Charged Alternate'.

Police officer victims have been identified through the 'Officer' victim type.

In most circumstances the Information Commissioner will not investigate a complaint unless an internal review procedure has been carried out, however the Commissioner has the option to investigate the matter at his discretion.
