Request and Answer:

Your request for information has now been considered. In respect of Section 1(1)(a) of the Act we can confirm that the Police Service of Northern Ireland does hold information to which your request relates. The decision has been taken to disclose the following.

Request 1

In total, how many persons have been dealt with by discretionary disposal/community resolution within the area served by the PSNI's Belfast District Command from 01.06.15 - 30.06.22 arising from the criminal offence of paying for sexual services of a person?

Answer

During 1 June 2015 - 30 June 2022, within Belfast District, 1 person received a Discretionary Disposal for the offence of paying for sexual services of a person.

Request 2

In total, how many persons have been dealt with by discretionary disposal/community resolution across all the PSNI's Districts from 01.06.15-30.06.22 arising from the criminal offence of paying for sexual services of a person?

Answer

During 1 June 2015 - 30 June 2022, across all Districts, 4 people received a Discretionary Disposal and 3 people received a Community Resolution Notice for the offence of paying for sexual services of a person.

In total, 7 people have received a Discretionary Disposal/Community Resolution Notice for this offence.
