### Request and Answer:

Your request for information has now been considered. In respect of Section 1(1)(a) of the Act we can confirm that the Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) does hold information to which your request relates. The decision has been taken to disclose the following:

# Request 1

How many false positive substance misuse tests there has been in the last 5 years?

#### Answei

PSNI can advise that there have been no false positive substance misuse tests in the last 5 years.

### Request 2

Where there has been a false positive result, how many police officers have lost their job or been refused a position within the PSNI?

# **Answer**

Due to the answer for Request 1 being 0, Request 2 is not applicable.

# Request 3

How many positive results have resulted in police officers having lost their job or been refused a position within the PSNI?

### Clarification:

Point 3 refers to persons applying for the PSNI to become an officer and current officers within the Organisation.

# Answer

As a result of a positive substance misuse test 1 officer was dismissed from the PSNI, and 6 applicants to the PSNI were refused appointment during the past 5 years.
