Your request for information has now been considered. In respect of Section 1(1)(a) of the Act we can confirm that the Police Service of Northern Ireland does hold information to which your request relates. The decision has been taken to disclose the following.

Request 1

The total number of vehicles on your fleet.

Answer

There are currently 2,724 vehicles in the PSNI fleet as of 29th September 2022.

Request 2

The number of vehicles on your fleet in each of the following drivetrain categories, split into response and non-response vehicles:

- Battery electric
- Plug-in hybrid electric
- Mild or full hybrid electric
- Hydrogen fuel cell electric
- Hydrogen fuel cell range-extended electric
- Petrol internal combustion engine
- Diesel internal combustion engine
- Other drivetrains (please describe)

Answer

The number of vehicles in our fleet in each of the following drivetrain categories are:

- Battery electric: 1
- Plug-in hybrid electric / Mild or full hybrid electric: 14
- Hydrogen fuel cell electric: 0
- Hydrogen fuel cell range-extended electric: 0
- Petrol internal combustion engine: 294
- Diesel internal combustion engine: 2385
- Other drivetrains (please describe): 30 ebikes

<u>Please note:</u> PSNI Fleet Management Information System does not show a breakdown between plug-in hybrid and mild or full hybrid electric or can it differentiate between response and non-

response vehicles.
