Request and Answer:

Your request for information has now been considered. In respect of Section 1(1)(a) of the Act we can confirm that the Police Service of Northern Ireland does hold information to which your request relates. The decision has been taken to disclose the following.

Request 1

The FOI request with regards to the Whistleblowing Procedure, how many senior officers by rank have been disciplined in the case of a whistle-blower's evidence being upheld, and what additional procedures have been put in place as to ensure that when a complaint is made that it is the responsibility for all officers at senior level to accurately record and advise PSD and Anti-Corruption of the same?

Clarification to Requester

Can you please give a timeframe for the information that you have requested?

Clarification from Requester

Yes I am looking for this information from 2nd January 2022 up to and including the 10th September 2022.

Answer

From 2nd January 2022 to 10th September 2022 no senior officers have been disciplined as the result of a whistle-blower's evidence being upheld. Senior officers in this case have been regarded as officers of the rank of Inspector and above.
