Request and Answer:

Your request for information has now been considered. In respect of Section 1(1)(a) of the Act we can confirm that the Police Service of Northern Ireland does hold information to which your request relates. The decision has been taken to disclose the following.

Request 1

The FOI request in relation to the spend of £11 million pounds on Rugged Laptops that do not operate in a range of areas in the province, no signals are obtained in Saintfield, Ballygomartin Road, Ligoneill, and throughout other counties, my request is:

Did the PSNI Procurement Team along with, I assume, your ICT Department carry out a full investigation of software and internet capability for the whole province before going ahead with the purchase of this very expensive equipment;

Answer 1

Throughout April 2020 to June 2021, PSNI ran a Business lead working group made up of representatives from across the organisation to evaluate the rugged laptops. During this period, a range of devices and pilots were carried out across the province involving a range of districts. A number of evaluation and engagement groups were carried out across each district such as 'Focus Groups', surveys followed to gather feedback. Benchmarking was also carried out against a number of other forces.

The rugged laptops have the capability to use Wi-Fi or 4G connection which is predicated on the current EE mobile sim contract which PSNI currently have with BT.

Request 2

What investigations and the length of trialling given to each of the manufacturers' laptops, and the capabilities of each laptop prior to procurement and the main reason for the procurement of those purchased.

Answer

Request 3

What further developments are in place so that all the internet coverage within the whole of the

province is being used to ensure that all officers are able to use the equipment that also includes their mobile phones?

Answer

Where coverage concerns have been identified, PSNI are working with BT to review options.
