Your request for information has now been considered. In respect of Section 1(1)(a) of the Act we can confirm that the Police Service of Northern Ireland does hold information to which your request relates. The decision has been taken to disclose the following.

## Request 1

Under the Freedom of Information Act I am requesting all information that Police Service of Northern Ireland hold in relation to Unidentified Flying Object/Unidentified Aerial Phenomena sightings for the period 1st January 2022 to the 20th December 2022.

This includes all reports made by members of the public or employees of Police Service of Northern Ireland and may include a keyword search of the following words: UFO, UAP, lights in the sky, aliens or extra-terrestrial beings.

This information should include

a) date,

b) time,

c) location

d) description given by the reporting person.

No personal identifying information should be included

## Answer

Between 1<sup>st</sup> January 2022 and 20<sup>th</sup> December 2022 there was 1 incident of UFO sightings reported to the Police Service of Northern Ireland. The incident reported occurred in the Stewartstown area of Dungannon on the 30<sup>th</sup> of October 2022. The caller reported seeing UFO flying towards Dungannon from Belfast.
