Request and Answer:

Your request for information has now been considered. In respect of Section 1(1)(a) of the Act we can confirm that the Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) does hold information to which your request relates. The decision has been taken to disclose the following.

Request 1

Please clarify if any reports have been made to PSNI in relation to allegations of abuse or any other offence, directed toward any member of Western Health and Social Care Trust staff since November 2022 to 3 March 2023, and specifically in respect of the suspension of emergency surgery at South West Acute Hospital?

Answer 1

PSNI can advise there has been no reports made to PSNI regarding allegations of abuse or any other offence directed towards any member of Western Health and Social Care Trust Staff in respect to the suspension of emergency surgery at South West Acute Hospital since November 2022.

Request 2

Also have any reports been made to PSNI and/or were officers required to take action around any for example - public disorderly in respect of the consultation events around the suspension of emergency surgery at South West Acute Hospital?

Answer 2

PSNI can advise there has been no reports regarding public disorder at any of the Consultation Events around the suspension of emergency surgery at South West Acute Hospital.

Additional Information regarding searches carried out in respect of this request:

In relation to request 1 and request 2 - extensive searches were carried out by Fermanagh & Omagh District in an attempt to capture any relevant information. Searches were conducted for all serials including "South West Acute Hospital" from the 1st November 2022 – 15th March 2023 and also for Western Health and Social Care Trust" 1st November 2022 - 15th March 2023. Any serials relating specifically to threats etc. against staff were reviewed. Furthermore, searches were carried out with addresses linked to South West Acute Hospital, Western Health & Social Care and also the address of the venues which hosted the Public Consultation event.

Please note:

There is no field on PSNI systems to capture an employer of a victim. Therefore if someone has reported abuse/disorder and they haven't used the relevant addresses, this would not be captured.

If you are dissatisfied in any way with the handling of your request, you have the right to request a review.
