Request and Answer:

Your request for information has now been considered and I am not obliged to supply the information you have requested.

Request 1

Please provide copies of all communications you hold between yourselves and the PFNI referring to the number of assaults on officers for the whole of 2021/22.

I'm trying to find out why the PFNI figure is so much higher than 911 (assaults that do not cause injury?)

Section 17(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires the Police Service of Northern Ireland, when refusing to provide such information (because the information is exempt) to provide the applicant with a notice which:

(a) states the fact,

- (b) specifies the exemption in question and
- (c) states (if that would not otherwise be apparent) why the exemption applies.

We can confirm there is no communication between the PSNI & PFNI referring to the number of assaults on officers for the whole of 2021/22 as the figures were taken from the PSNI website.

The following exemption has been applied:
