Key Statistics

- In the 12 months from 1st April 2022 to 31st March 2023, there were 2,809 stop and searches under the Police and Criminal Evidence (PACE) Order, of which the greatest number (41%) were in relation to stolen articles.
- There were 7 road checks authorised in 2022/23, all of which were for the purpose of ascertaining whether a vehicle was carrying a witness to an indictable offence.
- There were 21,474 arrests¹ made under the Police and Criminal Evidence (PACE) Order during 2022/23, 82% of which were males.
- During 2022/23 there were 49 persons detained in police custody for more than 24 hours and released without charge. During the same period there were 22 applications to Magistrates Courts for warrants of further detention.

1. Introduction

Police and Criminal Evidence (PACE) Order statistics for Northern Ireland are collated and produced by statisticians seconded to the Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) from the Northern Ireland and Statistics Research Agency (NISRA).

This bulletin presents Police and Criminal Evidence Order (PACE) statistics for the Police Service of Northern Ireland for the period 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023, as required by statute. Reported are statistics on

- i) the number of stop and searches under PACE by objective of search and the number of subsequent arrests.
- ii) the number of Article 6 (PACE) road checks authorised and the reason for these.
- iii) persons detained under PACE.

PACE detention statistics are based on a count of detainees' custody numbers and relate to the period of original detention only.

There were 7 road checks authorised in 2022/23, all of which were for the purpose of ascertaining whether a vehicle was carrying a witness to an indictable offence.

Extended Detention: During 2022/23 there were 49 persons who were detained in police custody for more than 24 hours and released without charge.

Magistrate's Warrants: There were 22 applications to Magistrates Courts for warrants of further detention in 2022/23, in relation to 17 individuals. Six of these applications were for 24 hours or less, 5 were for between 25 and 35 hours and the other 11 were for a period of 36 hours.

Of the 22 applications to Magistrates Courts for warrants of further detention, 5 of these were for a second warrant of further detention.

Of the 17 persons subject to a warrant of further detention, 9 spent less than 24 hours under its authority, while 3 spent between 24 hours and 36 hours and the remaining 5 people were detained over 36 hours under the authority of these warrants. A total of 10 persons were subsequently charged.

Intimate Searches: There was one intimate search recorded during 2022/23, which had a negative result.

X-rays & ultrasound scans: During 2022/23 5 x-rays were carried out, 2 of which were positive and 3 which were negative. No ultrasound scans were recorded.
