Introduction

Welcome to the Police Service of Northern Ireland's, understanding stalking and the support available to victims, toolkit - a series of assets and key messages that we need your help to reach all communities. What is stalking?

Since April 2022 Stalking has officially been a criminal offence in Northern Ireland. Since then, officers have arrested 230 alleged stalkers.

Statistics suggest that people will suffer up to 100 incidents before reporting to Police and that the pattern of fixated, obsessive, unwanted and repeated behaviours that they are experiencing often results in fear, trauma and a reduction in the victim's quality of life.

Stalking Protection Orders (SPOs)

SPOs provide another tool for police, as well as the courts, to help protect victims and improve their safety.

The orders now enable early police intervention, pre-conviction, to address stalking behaviours before they escalate.

When in place, an order can require a person to stop carrying out specific actions, but importantly can also impose prohibitions and positive requirements to further protect the victim and anyone connected to them, such as family or friends.

We want to:

- Increase awareness of stalking in all communities
- Increase reporting
- Make victims aware of the support available to them

The assets included in this toolkit will be shared across social media and online and physical assets will become visible in high footfall areas of our communities. We want people to be talking about stalking both online and in person.



Key messages

Please use the key messages below as guide for when you are talking about stalking.

What is stalking?

Behaviour that is fixated, obsessive, unwanted, repeated. Think FOUR. Don't ignore the warning signs, visit the Police Service's website to read the warning signs.

Did you know stalking is now a criminal offence in Northern Ireland?

Under the Protection from Stalking Act (Northern Ireland) 2022 stalkers are punishable by up to 10 years in prison. Victims don't have to suffer in silence. If you think you are experiencing stalking, this is serious.

Report to Police online, via 101 or 999 in an emergency.

Stalking can be more than just physical

Online stalking and harassment is also a crime. We know this can take over your life. Know the signs, report to Police.

Have you seen any warning signs of stalking?

Red flags include:

- Regularly following someone and tracking their movements
- Repeatedly going uninvited to their home or workplace
- Checking someone's internet use, email or other communications
- Hanging around somewhere they know the person often visits
- Interfering with their property
- Watching or spying on someone
- Identity theft (buying things in someone's name)

What happens if I report to Police?

Detectives in the Police's Public
Protection Branch are committed to
investigating all reports of stalking,
all reports are taken incredibly
seriously. They have specifically trained
detectives who will treat you with
sensitivity and respect and support you
throughout the entire criminal justice
process.

Help and support is available to victims of stalking and harassment

What are stalking protection orders?

These orders are another tool in police's armory to protect victims of this debilitating and dangerous crime.

Officers want to stop stalkers in their tracks by putting in place measures that will prohibit their actions.
