



Christmas drink/drug driving campaign 2023/24 Northern Ireland

Published: 24th January 2024

This bulletin summarises available information in relation to the PSNI Christmas drink/drug driving campaign 2023/24, which ran from 1st December 2023 to 1st January 2024 inclusive, specifically the outcomes in terms of Preliminary Breath Tests (PBTs) and drink/drug driving arrests.

These figures are provisional and subject to change, particularly for PBTs which are likely to increase as more information is uploaded to the system.

Key points:

- Initial figures show that PSNI officers conducted 7,250 preliminary breath tests (PBTs) during the Christmas drink/drug drive campaign between 1st December 2023 and 1st January 2024. While this is a decrease of 27.7% on the same period last year, it is likely that the 2023/24 total will increase as more information is uploaded to the system from the PBT devices.
- Of the 7,250 PBTs conducted, 4.9% (355) resulted in a fail or failed to provide, a similar proportion when compared with the 2022/23 campaign (5.2%).
- A total of 298 people were arrested for drink/drug driving related offences during this year's campaign, representing a decrease of 3.9% compared with the same period last year (310).
- The highest number of arrests were made in Belfast (65), while Fermanagh and Omagh experienced the largest decrease in arrests when compared with the same period last year (from 31 to 9).
- Males accounted for the majority (82.6%) of those arrested for drink/drug driving offences throughout the 23/24 campaign, while over half of those arrested were between 30 and 49 years old.
- The highest evidential breath test reading recorded over the campaign was 159µg/100ml.
- The youngest person arrested for drink/drug driving offences during the 2023/24 campaign was 14 years old while the oldest was 82 years old.

Background

There is no one measure of counting alcohol or drug driving offences as this is a complex process and there is no unique source of data. This bulletin has presented the information on the basis that those who have a Preliminary Breath Test with a result of 'Fail' or 'Failure to Provide' are a proxy measure for driving when under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Police will arrest people, collect further evidence via breath, blood or urine and present this to the Public Prosecution Service (PPS) who will ultimately decide on the prospect of a successful case.

In terms of the 2023/24 statistics, the PBT figures are based on an extract of the data on 22nd January 2024 and are likely to increase as more information is uploaded to the system. The arrest figures were extracted on 12th January 2023 and will be subject to minor amendment. These figures are therefore provisional and subject to change.
