





Our opening speaker is retired Chief Constable Mike Barton who is an expert in all things problem solving, evidence based policing and innovative practices, as well as a very entertaining speaker. He has been a keen proponent of problem-orientated policing and integrated offender management, including restorative justice, and successfully embedded these concepts in Lancashire and Durham Constabularies.

He will be offering his insights and experiences around how he delved into this world and embedded this approach.

During his three years as crime operations lead for the National Police Chiefs' Council, Mr Barton oversaw the restructure of the national Holmes computer network and was awarded the Queen's Police Medal in 2014.



Professor Aiden Sidebottom

Professor Aiden Sidebottom will talk you through his steps for successful problem solving.

Aiden's main research interests are problem-oriented policing, situational crime prevention and crime prevention evaluation.

Aiden has worked on various projects with numerous sponsors including the AHRC, ESRC, EPSRC, Home Office and several UK police forces. He has published over 25 articles in the fields of policing and criminology in journals such as Criminology. Journal of Research in Crime and Delinguency and Journal of Experimental Criminology. He first ioined UCL in 2006 as a Research Assistant and later Research Associate. Between 2009 and 2012 Aiden pursued his Ph.D. full time.

He is also one of the Judging Panel for the International Problem Solving Awards, The Goldstein Awards **Education Authority Youth Stephen Quigley**

Stephen Quigley of Education Authority Youth Service will talk you through their model to engage with young people effectively. This model helps to prevent children and young people from becoming involved in youth violence or child criminal exploitation.

This promises to be a really useful conversation as Stephen has a wealth of operational experience in this area. Workshop Safeguarding Board for Northern Ireland

Colleagues from SBNI will hold a workshop based around our awareness of trauma when engaging with children and young people. It will also cover the prevalence of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and how being aware of this will assist us when we are working to support young people.
