



# Christmas drink/drug driving campaign 2024/25 Northern Ireland

Published: 23rd January 2025

This bulletin summarises available information in relation to the PSNI Christmas drink/drug driving campaign 2024/25, which ran from 1<sup>st</sup> December 2024 to 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025 inclusive, specifically the outcomes in terms of Preliminary Breath Tests (PBTs) and drink/drug driving arrests.

These figures are provisional and subject to change, particularly for PBTs which are likely to increase as more information is uploaded to the system.

## **Key points:**

- Initial figures show that PSNI officers conducted 5,556 preliminary breath tests (PBTs) during the Christmas drink/drug drive campaign between 1<sup>st</sup> December 2024 and 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025. While this is a decrease of 30.8% on the same period last year, it is likely that the 2024/25 total will increase as more information is uploaded to the system from the PBT devices.
- Of the 5,556 PBTs conducted, 7.3% (407) resulted in a fail or failed to provide, which is proportionately higher than for the 2023/24 campaign (5.4%).
- A total of 298 people were arrested for drink/drug driving related offences during this year's campaign, representing a decrease of 2.3% compared with the same period last year (305).
- The highest number of arrests were made in Belfast (57), while Mid Ulster experienced the largest decrease in arrests when compared with the same period last year (from 38 to 23).
- Males accounted for the majority (87.6%) of those arrested for drink/drug driving
  offences throughout the 24/25 campaign, while over half of those arrested (57.0%)
  were between 30 and 49 years old.
- The highest evidential breath test reading recorded over the campaign was 145µg/100ml.
- The youngest person arrested for drink/drug driving offences during the 2024/25 campaign was 18 years old while the oldest was 72 years old.

## Background

There is no one measure of counting alcohol or drug driving offences as this is a complex process and there is no unique source of data. This bulletin has presented the information on the basis that those who have a Preliminary Breath Test with a result of 'Fail' or 'Failure to Provide' are a proxy measure for driving when under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Police will arrest people, collect further evidence via breath, blood or urine and present this to the Public Prosecution Service (PPS) who will ultimately decide on the prospect of a successful case.

In terms of the 2024/25 statistics, the PBT figures are based on an extract of the data on 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2025 and are likely to increase as more information is uploaded to the system. The arrest figures were extracted on 20<sup>th</sup> January 2025 and will be subject to minor amendment. These figures are therefore provisional and subject to change.
